# Discretionary Group Updates

In Fiscal Year 2023, the OIE will be tackling new and exciting work related to Native Language restoration, supporting the retention of Native teachers, and advancing systemic change opportunities between Tribal and State Educational Agencies.

# FY 2023 Discretionary Grantmaking Upcoming Work

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- \$1.5 million for a new program, the Native American Language Resource Centers (NALRC) program.
- \$2.75 million for a Native American Teacher Retention Initiative (NATRI) under the Demonstration Authority.
- Estimated \$1.6- 2.4 million for a new State Tribal Education Partnership (STEP) program.

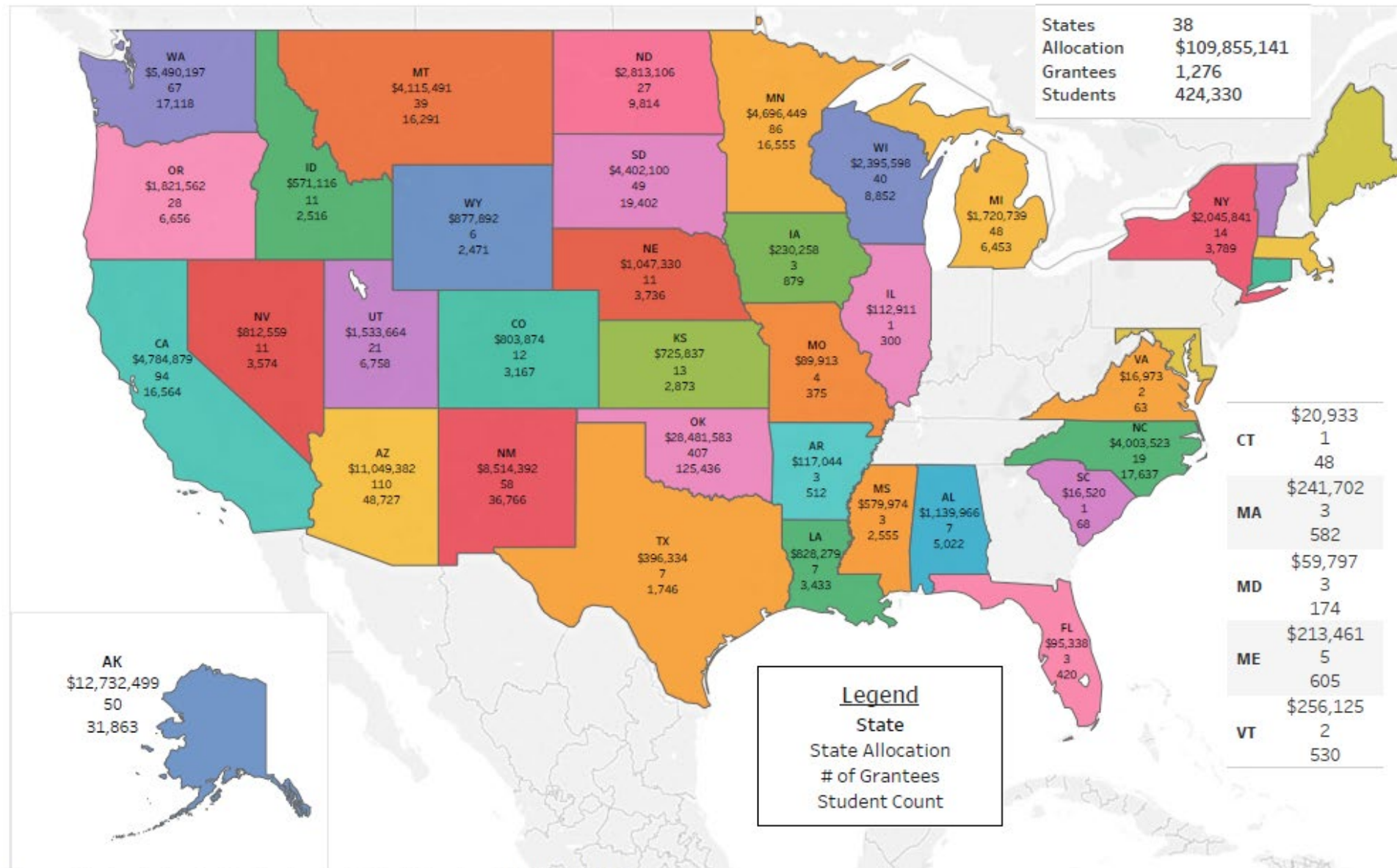




# Formula Group Updates

In School Year 2022-23, the OIE issued 1,276 grants impacting over 424,300 Native students across 38 states with a total disbursement of \$109,855,141.
